UNIT II: Encouragement From A Tested Servant

All lessons this month continue to focus on selected passages from I and II Corinthians written by the Apostle Paul to the church at Corinth

- **WEEK 1- Glory of The New Covenant:** This lesson focuses on showing how the new covenant, which was given by Christ, is different from the old covenant.
- **WEEK 2- Our Heavenly Dwelling:** This lesson discusses our future hope in heaven and gives us a glimpse of the glory that awaits us
- **WEEK 3- Ambassadors For Christ:** This lesson teaches us that our greatest purpose in life is to be Ambassadors for Christ
- **WEEK 4- Spiritual Weapons:** This lesson deals with spiritual warfare and the difference between the weapons Christians have and what the world has

WEEKS 5-Paul's Thorn In The Flesh: This lesson focuses on Paul's heavenly vision and the purpose behind the thorn in his flesh

LESSON TITLE: Glory of the New Covenant

LESSON TEXT: II Corinthians 3:7-18

RELATED SCRIPTURES: Exodus 34:29-35; II Corinthians 4:13-18

GOLDEN TEXT: "Now the Lord is that Spirit: and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty"

(II Corinthians 3:17)

TARGET AGE GROUP: This week's discussion is taken from the **Adult Bible Class** book.

- 3. How did the old covenant fulfill its purpose?
- 4. How should we view the law in terms of obedience?
- 5. Why were the children of Israel unable to look at Moses' face?
- 6. Why did the glory of the new covenant far exceed the glory of the old covenant?
- 7. What did Paul say about the old covenant in comparison to the new covenant?
- 8. What is the basis of the Christian's hope, according to Paul?
- 9. Why can we be bold in our proclamation of the gospel?
- 10. What does the fact that the glory faded from Moses' face tell us about the old covenant?

- 7. What is the Christian's "earnest," or guarantee, of one day receiving a heavenly dwelling?
- 8. Why does the Christian not need to see death as a source of despair?
- 9. What is the judgement seat of Christ?

- 6. What was Paul's motivation in going to Corinth?
- 7. What did Paul want the Corinthians to perceive about him?
- 8. Why did Paul think it was wrong for anyone to boast in themselves?
- 9. What is the only thing for us to boast about?
- 10. Who will receive commendation from the Lord?

- 5. Why was Paul content to expose his weakness to the Corinthians?
- 6. Why are we not told what Paul's thorn in the flesh was?
- 7. What message did God bring to Paul through the thorn that Satan tried to use for evil?
- 8. How did Paul respond to the thorn at first?
- 9. How did God respond to Paul's plea for help?
- 10. What lesson did Paul learn from his suffering?
