The following information is provided for participants who wish to study the lesson beforehand. The study materials are part of the **International Sunday School Lesson**, excerpted from the **Union Gospel Press Sunday School book.** 

The overview will be presented each Sunday Morning @ 9:00, prior to regular Sunday Morning Worship Service (except for 1<sup>st</sup> Sundays). Lesson discussion material will be rotated weekly amongst the various Target Groups (Adult Women, Adult Men, Young Adult, Youth) in an effort to include all ages in this lesson series.

The Overview is merely a brief discussion of the bible lesson. In order to gain a better understanding of the lesson, it is recommended that, prior to each lesson, participants read through the **Lesson Text**, **Related Scriptures**, **Daily Bible Reading** scriptures (each day), try to answer the **Discussion Questions**, and make a note of any additional questions you may have. Prayer and meditation are always essential in gaining a better understanding of God's Word and its relevance to your life and situation.

#### November 2022 UNIT III: Obedience In Society

# All lessons this month will come from the books of Exodus and Leviticus and will show how obedience that honors God affects our daily living.

WEEK 1-Obedience in Justice: This lesson will show how treating everyone with justice matters to God

WEEK 2- Obedience In Rest: This lesson will show how we honor God by setting aside the day He ordained for rest

WEEK 3- Obedience Among Neighbors: This lesson will show how loving our neighbor is at the heart of living in obedience to God's law

WEEK 4- Obedience In Celebration: This lesson will show that God owns everything and we are responsible to Him in how we use what He has given us

DATE OF LESSON: November 6, 2022 LESSON TITLE: Obedience in Justice LESSON TEXT: Exodus 23:1-9 RELATED SCRIPTURES: Deuteronomy 19:15-21; Proverbs 6:16-19; Isaiah 10:1-4; Jeremiah 5:25-29; Mark 14:55-59 GOLDEN TEXT: "Keep thee far from false matter; and the innocent and righteous slay thou not: for I will not justify the wicked" (Exodus 23:7)

TARGET AGE GROUP: This week's discussion is taken from the Adult Bible Class book.

#### **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

- 1. What harm can result from yielding to peer pressure and following the views of the majority?
- 2. How can we resist following the opinions of the crowd?
- 3. Are the poor to be shown favor over the rich? Explain
- 4. What is God's method of dealing with enemies?
- 5. What good can result from helping an enemy in a hard situation?
- 6. Why are political officials inclined to side with the rich?
- 7. Was oppression of the poor a problem in Israel? How do we know?
- 8. How will God deal with those who condemn the innocent?
- 9. Why does Scripture so strongly condemn the practice of bribery?
- 10. What special favors were Israelites to give to resident aliens?

TARGET AGE GROUP: This week's discussion is taken from the Young Adult Bible Class book.

#### **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

- 2. What specifically were Israelites commanded to do and not to do on the Sabbath?
- 3. Why are people no longer put to death in Israel for violating the Sabbath?
- 4. How can the sanctity of the Sabbath be compared to the ark of the covenant?
- 5. How did the Sabbath remind Israel in all generations of the covenant?
- 6. In what sense is the Sabbath personal between God and Jewish people and a sign until the end of days?

- 7. How should God's people love their neighbors?
- 8. How were foreigners who dwelled in the land to be treated by the Israelites?
- 9. What should characterize all our business transactions?

- 6. What relationship did God have to the land and its people?
- 7. When was the Jubilee Year to take place?
- 8. In what way was the Jubilee Year a year of liberty?
- 9. How were the Sabbath Year and the Jubilee Year to be occasions for joy?
- 10. What are some practical values of these two events for us?
