

# HOPEWELL MB CHURCH VIRTUAL INTERNATIONAL SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON OVERVIEW STUDY GUIDE

The following information is provided for participants who wish to study the lesson beforehand. The study materials are part of the **International Sunday School Lesson**, excerpted from the **Union Gospel Press Sunday School book**.

The lesson will be presented each Sunday Morning @ 8:30, prior to regular Sunday Morning Worship Service. Lesson discussion material will be rotated weekly amongst the various Target Groups (Adult Women, Adult Men, Young Adult, Youth) in an effort to include all ages in this lesson series.

This is merely a brief discussion of the bible lesson. In order to gain a better understanding of the lesson, it is recommended that, prior to each lesson, participants read through the **Lesson Text**, **Related Scriptures**, **Daily Bible Reading** scriptures (each day), try to answer the **Discussion Questions**, and make a note of any additional questions you may have. Prayer and meditation are always essential in gaining a better understanding of God's Word and its relevance to your life and situation.

### May 2023 UNIT III: By His Teachings

All lessons this month will continue the teachings of Jesus

- **WEEK 1-The Good Shepherd:** This lesson will help us to establish a better relationship with Jesus by showing that He is our Good Shepherd who watches over and protects us
- **WEEK 2- The Resurrection and the Life:** This lesson will show how we can experience the resurrection and the life to come with Jesus when we believe in Him
- **WEEK 3- The True Vine:** This lesson exhorts Christians to cultivate the kind of relationship with Christ that helps them to bear fruit in their lives
- **WEEK 4- Jesus Prays for Believers:** This lesson reveals the heart of Jesus as He prays first for His disciples and then for future believers

**DATE OF LESSON:** May 7, 2023 **LESSON TITLE:** The Good Shepherd

LESSON TEXT: John 10:7-18

**RELATED SCRIPTURES:** Psalm 23:1-6; Jeremiah 23:1-6; Ezekiel 34:10-25; I Peter 5:1-4 **GOLDEN TEXT:** "I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd giveth his life for the sheep"

(John 10:11)

TARGET AGE GROUP: This week's discussion is taken from the Adult Bible Class book.

#### **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

- 1. What factor made it possible for a shepherd to always lead his own sheep out every morning?
- 2. What did Jesus mean when He referred to Himself as the Door (John 10:7)?
- 3. Who were the "thieves" (v. 8) of Jesus' day, and what were they doing to harm the people?
- 4. How does the sheepfold picture our salvation?
- 5. What was the difference between a shepherd and a hireling?
- 6. What do we know about Jesus as our personal shepherd?
- 7. How did Jesus illustrate the relationship He has with His sheep?
- 8. Who are the "other sheep" (v. 16)?
- 9. What important truth did Jesus communicate about His death?
- 10. What did Jesus do that no one else can ever do after death?

**GOLDEN TEXT:** "I am the resurrection, and the life: he that believeth in me, though he were

dead, yet shall he live" (John 11:25)

**TARGET AGE GROUP:** This week's discussion is taken from the **Young Adult Bible Class** book.

#### **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

- 1. Why was it significant that Lazarus' body had been in the tomb four days?
- 2. From where did people come in order to comfort Lazarus' sisters?
- 3. Who went to meet Jesus, and how did she express her disappointment?
- 4. What prevented her from believing that Jesus could heal her brother from a distance?
- 5. What did Jesus want to accomplish through the declaration He made?
- 6. What miracle would Jesus do to confirm His declaration?
- 7. What question did Jesus ask Martha?
- 8. How did Martha respond to Jesus' question?

#### **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

- 1. What was the setting of Jesus' prayer in John 17?
- 2. How had Jesus manifested God's name to His disciples (v. 6)?
- 3. What did Jesus affirm about the disciples' spiritual understanding?
- 4. From what did Jesus ask the Father to keep His disciples?
- 5. What kind of unity did Jesus want for His disciples?
- 6. Why would the world hate the disciples after Jesus' departure?
- 7. What did Jesus say in light of that?
- 8. What did Jesus mean when He asked the Father to sanctify the disciples (v. 17)?
- 9. How is personal sanctification accomplished?
- 10. What did Jesus pray in regard to us?
