DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. What two people and what two towns are mentioned in this account of Peter's ministry?
- 2. What was Dorcas' reputation among the people of Joppa?
- 3. What happened to Dorcas that caused sorrow in the town, and what did the people do with her?
- 4. To whom did Dorcas' friends reach out for help, and what made them think of doing this?
- 5. How did the people of Joppa let Peter know how much Dorcas had meant to them?
- 6. What initial action by Peter mimicked what Jesus had done?
- 7. Why is it important to know that Peter prayed before doing anything else?
- 8. What happened after his prayer?
- 9. What happened in Joppa as a result of this incident?
- 10. Where did Peter stay, and why is this significant?

RELATED SCRIPTURES: I Samuel 13:8-14; 15:1-23; Psalm 51:1-19; Mark 7:14-23 **GOLDEN TEXT:** "The Lord seeth not as man seeth; for man looketh on the outward

appearance,

but the Lord looketh on the heart" (I Samuel 16:7)

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. Who was the first king of Israel, and what finally precipitated his rejection by God?
- 2. Where was Samuel told to go, and what was the potential problem he was worried about?
- 3. How did God provide protection for Samuel?
- 4. What specific directions did God give Samuel, and what did He not yet tell him?
- 5. What truth did God give Samuel when he was considering Eliab?
- 6. Why is this truth just as important for us today as it was then?
- 7. Why was it logical for Jesse to present his sons in order of age?
- 8. How was God probably communicating with Samuel, and why should this be an encouragement to us?
- 9. How does the text describe David?
- 10. What did the anointing and the coming of the Spirit do for David?

- 1. What important position did Naaman hold?
- 2. In what other ways is Naaman described, and what does each description indicate about him?
- 3. What marred the exalted position and reputation that Naaman enjoyed?
- 4. What seemingly insignificant person suddenly became significant to Naaman and his king?
- 5. What did the Syrian king do after hearing Naaman's report?
- 6. What happened after the king's request reached the king of Israel?
- 7. What did Elisha instruct Naaman to do?
- 8. How did Naaman respond, and what were his reasons for doing so?
- 9. How did Naaman become convinced he should do what Elisha had said, and what was the result?
- 10. What happened after Naaman saw he had been completely cleansed?

- 2. How was King Josiah notified of the law scroll's discovery?
- 3. Why did Josiah send a delegation to Huldah the prophetess?
- 4. What was Josiah's first act as he sought revival for the nation?
- 5. What kinds of people joined Josiah and the elders at the temple?
- 6. What promise did Josiah make after reading the Law to the people?
- 7. How did the congregation show their assent to the decision made by Josiah?
- 8. What types of reforms did Josiah make following his commitment to the covenant?
- 9. Why was reinstitution of the Passover important?
- 10. What kind of legacy did Josiah leave behind him?
