- 4. How was Hannah's faith based on her knowledge of God's attributes?
- 5. How was Hannah able to see the hand of God at work?
- 6. What gives God the right to rule over the earth?
- 7. How did the power of God cause Hannah to trust in Him?
- 8. Why can we trust God even when it seems that wickedness is winning the battle?
- 9. What was the great promise of God that concluded Hannah's prayer?

LESSON TEXT: Esther 3:2-3, 5-6a; 4:7-16

RELATED SCRIPTURES: Esther 1:1-3; 3:7-4:6; Genesis 12:1-3; Daniel 3:14-28

GOLDEN TEXT: "So will I go in unto the king, which is not according to the law: and if I

perish, I perish" (Esther 4:16)

TARGET AGE GROUP: This week's discussion is taken from the Junior High School Bible

Class book.

LESSON REVIEW

- 1. Do you think that you are brave?
- 2. Do you think that you could be brave enough to risk your life to save someone?
- 3. Why was Haman upset? Because Mordecai refused to bow down to him
- **4.** How did Haman plan to get back at Mordecai for his refusal to bow and do homage to him? He convinced the king that the Jews were bad people and that they should be killed
- **5. What did Mordecai tell Esther to do?** He told Esther to go to the king and beg him to save the Jews
- **6. Why did Mordecai's request require Esther to be brave?** The king did not know Esther was a Jew. If the king refused to listen to Esther, she could be killed
- **7.** What did Mordecai tell Esther to encourage her? He told her that her position as queen for a special purpose
- 8. Who has God placed in your life to encourage you to be brave and to do what is right?

LESSON TITLE: The Jews Are Saved From Their Enemies

LESSON TEXT: Esther 8:3-8; 9:18-23

RELATED SCRIPTURES: Esther 5:1-7:10; 8:15-9:16; Psalm 106:1-5, 44-48

GOLDEN TEXT: "Therefore the Jews of the villages, that dwelt in the unwalled towns,

made the fourteenth day of the month, Adar a day of gladness and feasting, and a good day, and a sending portions one to another "

(Esther 9:19)

TARGET AGE GROUP: This week's discussion is taken from the **Primary Bible Class** book.

LESSON REVIEW

- 1. Have you ever been in a really scary situation?
- 2. What scary situation was Esther in? The king had signed a law ordering all the Jews to be killed
- 3. Why was this scary for Esther? She was a Jew; the king did not know Esther was a Jew also
- **4. What did Esther ask the king?** Esther asked the king to change the law which Haman created just to get rid of her people (the Jews).
- 5. What was the king's response to Esther? He gave Haman to Esther to have hanged in the gallows Haman had built for the Jews. He also allowed Esther to write another law and to put his seal on it
- **6. What did Esther and Mordecai write?** They wrote a law allowing the Jews to defend themselves against anyone who tried to kill them
- 7. Will you choose to trust God even when it seems risky?

LESSON TEXT: Luke 7:36-50

RELATED SCRIPTURES: John 12:1-8; Matthew 18:23-35; Luke 15:1-7; 19:1-10 **GOLDEN TEXT:** "He said to the woman, Thy faith hath saved thee; go in peace"

(Luke 7:50)

TARGET AGE GROUP: This week's discussion is taken from the Beginner Bible Class

book.

LESSON REVIEW

- 1. Whose house did Jesus accept the invitation to eat at? A Pharisee named Simon
- 2. What did the sinful woman bring with her? She brought some ointment to anoint Jesus' feet
- 3. How was what the woman did more honoring than what Simon did? Both Simon and the woman needed to be forgiven, but Simon did not see his need to be forgiven like the woman who washed Jesus' feet with her tears and dried them with her hair
- 4. **How did Simon react to what the woman did?** He thought it was wrong that Jesus let the woman touch him because she was a sinner
- **5. How did Jesus respond to Simon?** Jesus told Simon that people will be very thankful for His forgiveness when they understand how much they need to be forgiven
- 6. What did Jesus say to the woman? He told her that her faith saved her and to go in peace
- 7. Have you ever done or said something you felt really sorry about?
